Riedenburg lies embedded in the fantastic scenery of the Altmühl Valley, framed by picturesque Jura rocks and splendid deciduous forests, at the bottom of Rosenberg Castle and the two ruins of Rabenstein and Tachenstein. Historic masonry, among which we also find the castles of Prunn and Eggersberg, interesting museums, breathtaking views and very special experiences – you are just right to find all that in Riedenburg!

A well-built network of bike and hiking trails directly leads you into beautiful nature – for example on two of the most popular German trails, the Altmühltal Panoramaweg (hiking) or on the Altmühltal-Radweg (cycling). Whether it's hiking, cycling or just enjoying the nature from a boat – Riedenburg offers a lot of possibilities for leisure and recreation. Furthermore various culinary delights and regional delicacies, such as the Altmühltal lamb, will be offered to you by local restaurateurs. Enjoy your stay in wonderful Riedenburg!



History

Town Development

Riedenburg looks back to a long and eventful history. The earliest written mentioning of „Ritenburg“ as a place name goes back to the year 1112. As a town Riedenburg was mentioned for the first time in 1329. The ancient lineage of the counts of Riedenburg, from which outstanding minstrels came, already reigned from the year 976 onwards. The counts' coat of arms is still Riedenburg's town coat of arms.

Until 1972 Riedenburg was the seat of the Riedenburg rural district which belonged to the Bavarian county of Upper Palatinate. In the course of an area reform the rural district of Riedenburg was divided and the town of Riedenburg and its surroundings were integrated into the rural district of Kelheim in the Bavarian county of Lower Bavaria. Based on this regrouping eleven nearby communities joined the town of Riedenburg between 1972 and 1978. In 1992 the construction of the Main-Danube-Canal was started in the city center. Construction works lasted until 1992.

We invite you to discover the numerous viewpoints on our well-built hiking-trails. The breathtaking view over Riedenburg and the Altmühl Valley will help you to summon up strength from nature.

Even pleasure cyclists appreciate this varied natural experience and take a hearty „Brotzeit“-snack or a meal of the delicious Bavarian cuisine before starting the next leg of their tour.

It doesn't matter what kind of activity you enjoy: hiking, Nordic walking, mountain climbing, hang-gliding or just admiring the unique natural beauty from the deck of an excursion boat – here everybody can find something suitable.



Theme Trails

In and around Riedenburg you find special theme trails offering informative pleasure for all ages.

Bienenlehrpfad (Honey Bee Educational Path)

Starting from the locks at Haidhof, a local part of town, there is the honey bee educational path. On various information boards you are informed about the world of bees. Besides you can watch the bees from a safe distance. Open all year round free of charge.

Drei-Burgen-Steig (Three-Castles-Path)

The Three-Castles-Path connects Rosenberg Castle with the ruins of Tachenstein and Rabenstein on a circular walk. The starting point is at the Tourist Information Office. From there you will find your way passing Tachenstein, Rosenberg Castle, Rabenstein and back to the starting point. Information boards along the way tell you exciting details from Riedenburg's history.

Duration: approx. 1.5 to 2 hours

Fischereilehrpfad (Fishing Educational Path)

On a 10 km long trail from Meihern to Riedenburg you find 21 information boards telling you interesting facts about the flora and fauna of the Altmühl Valley. The habitats were formed millions of years ago by the lagoons of the Jura Sea. The educational path deals with local species of fish but also describes life under water.

Duration: approx. 2.5 hours

Klangweg (Sound Trail)

The Sound Trail offers visitors a special listening experience. At 11 different stations along the Main-Danube-Canal and on the Jachenhausen mountain you can listen to the sounds of nature or create unusual sounds yourselves at stations called "Hallröhre" (hall tube), "Summstein" (humming stone) or "Lauschstation" (listening station).

Duration: approx. 1.5 hours



Hiking Trails

Altmühltal-Panoramaweg

This trail is regarded as one of Germany's most beautiful hiking trails. On approximately 200 km you can enjoy various stages along the Altmühl River, passing prominent Jura rocks and impressive castles. Tip: Look for "Schlaufenweg 25". In the Riedenburg area the Jurasteig goes parallel to the Altmühl-Panoramaweg .

Klamm-Wanderweg

The adventurous hiking trail from Riedenburg to Einthal, which leads you approx. 10 km through a nature forest reserve with giant trees and narrow climbing paths, starts at the Tourist Information Office. The trail goes through a wild and romantic maze of rocks, called "Klamm", and is secured by rails and footbridges. From one of the rocks you have a wonderful view overlooking the Altmühl Valley with Prunn Castle on the opposite side.

Local Riedenburg hiking trails

The trails No. 2, 6, 11, 13, 14, 16 and 17 have their starting point in Riedenburg. They are maintained and marked with signs by committed hiking enthusiasts. Just ask for hiking maps at the Tourist-Info.

Roßkopfsteig

If you choose this trail you will be surprised by the beauty of nature. Four different routes amidst wonderful scenery lead you to great viewpoints overlooking the Altmühl Valley. The historical nature experience trail starts at the King Ludwig Monument in Deising and goes up to one of the largest Bavarian Jura plateaus with the Roßkopf mountain summit at the end.



Nordic-Walking

There are three marked Nordic walking routes in Riedenburg. The starting points are at the riverside promenade near the town pond. The respective flyers are available at the Tourist-Info.

Dichterweg (Poets' Trail)

Degree of difficulty: medium

Duration: 75 minutes

This trail is 4.3 km long and comprises 204 vertical meters. It's ideal for beginners and advanced Nordic walkers.

Drei-Brücken-Weg (Three-Bridges-Trail)

Degree of difficulty: easy

Duration: 40 minutes

This trail is 4.2 km long and with 34 vertical meters the shortest route. It's ideal for beginners and even advisable for handicapped people.

Nibelungen-Trail

Degree of difficulty: challenging

Duration: 2 hours

The Nibelungen Trail is the longest circular course with a length of 10.1 km and 272 vertical meters and thus most suitable for advanced Nordic walkers.



Bike Trails

Altmühltal-Radweg

Route: Gunzenhausen – Treuchtlingen – Eichstätt – Beilngries – Dietfurt – Riedenburg – Essing – Kelheim

Degree of difficulty: easy

Distance: from the Altmühl Lakes near Gunzenhausen to Kelheim 160 km (optional: Rothenburg ob der Tauber – Gunzenhausen: 74 km), approximately 25 km of that in the Kelheim rural district.

Route description: A real classic among Germany's most famous bike trails. You are riding your bike through the unique scenery of the Altmühl Valley Nature Park along the leisurely flowing river Altmühl on well-maintained bike trails from Gunzenhausen to Dietfurt. From there you follow the service roads of the Main-Danube-Canal to Kelheim.

Fünf-Flüsse-Radweg (Five Rivers Bike Trail)

Route: Kelheim – Riedenburg – Beilngries – Neumarkt – Nürnberg – Hersbruck – Amberg – Schmidmühlen – Regensburg – Kelheim – Riedenburg

Degree of difficulty: easy / medium

Distance: 340 km, approximately 80 km of that in the Kelheim rural district

Route description: This mostly flat trail leads you through the natural beauty of the Bavarian Jura along the five rivers Danube, Altmühl (Main-Danube-Canal), Pegnitz, Vils, Naab on a circular route consisting of several local bike trails. In the Kelheim rural district the Fünf-Flüsse-Radweg between Regensburg and Kelheim corresponds with the Donau-Radweg and between Kelheim and Dietfurt it corresponds with the Altmühltal-Radweg.

Räuber und Ritter Tour (Robbers and Knights Tour)

Route: Riedenburg – Altmannstein – Schamhaupten – Thann – Riedenburg

Degree of difficulty: medium, 283 vertical meters

Distance: 27 km

Route description: This trail leads you through hills and valleys to various castle views. Tip: Don't miss the birds of prey flight show at Rosenberg Castle.

Schambachtalbahn-Radweg

Route: Riedenburg – Hexenagger – Altmannstein – Sandersdorf – Bettbrunn – Kösching – Ingolstadt

Degree of difficulty: easy / medium

Distance: 42 km

Route description: A scenic connection route from the Altmühl Valley to the Danube Valley and Ingolstadt. From Riedenburg you cycle on a former railway line to a romantic “Hammerschmiede” (hammer mill) along the slowly meandering Schambach river to Altmannstein. From there it goes up to the pilgrimage church of Bettbrunn. Crossing the Kösching Forest you finally reach Kösching before you arrive at Ingolstadt.

Stromtreter – Altmühl – Donau – Tour (E-Bike Tour)

Route: Riedenburg - Buch – Echendorf – Hienheim – Eining – Weltenburg – Kelheim – Essing – Riedenburg

Degree of difficulty: challenging (478 vertical meters)

Distance: 50 km

Route description: A challenging E-bike tour through the hilly Hienheim Forest down to the Altmühl and Danube Valley. Discover the longest archaeological park of Europe, the Weltenburg Monastery and the Three-Castles-Town of Riedenburg. Mind the departure times of the cable ferry at Eining!

Tour de Baroque

Route: Neumarkt in der Oberpfalz – Freystadt – Beilngries - Riedenburg- Kelheim – Regensburg – Straubing -

Deggendorf – Passau

Degree of difficulty: easy

Distance: 270 km, approx. 50 km of that in the rural district of Kelheim

Route description: This trail is one of oldest long-distance bike trails in Germany. Between Neumarkt and Regensburg it corresponds with the Fünf-Flüsse-Radweg and between Beilngries and Kelheim it is identical to the Altmühltal-Radweg. From Kelheim to Passau you follow the Donau-Radweg. Except for a light uphill gradient in the first part of the route the trail is pretty flat.

Free Time Tips

In the following text you find free time tips which are also mentioned in our panorama plan.

Fishing

The Fischereiverein Riedenburg e.V. (fishing club) offers fishermen and –women various opportunities for their hobby. In the Main-Danube-Canal and its backwaters pike, carp, zander, tench and eel are romping about. Day and Week Fishing Cards are available at the Tourist Info.

Archäologiepark Altmühltal (Archaeological Park)

A thrilling time travel is waiting for you in Europe's biggest and always free accessible archaeological park, the Archäologiepark Altmühltal. On 40 km and 18 stations archaeology becomes real in the true sense of the word. The well-marked route can be explored on foot or by bike. Many stations can also comfortably be reached by car or bus.

Viewpoint Falkenhorst

The viewpoint Falkenhorst high above Gundlfing, a part of town west of Riedenburg, is about 5 km away from the town center and promises you a gigantic view of the Altmühl Valley and the complete loop of the Altmühl River.

Viewpoint Flügelsberg

The former Spornburg Castle lay high above Meihern, a local part of Riedenburg, on a rocky hilltop which stretches out south-westwards into the Altmühl Valley. This castle, now in scarce ruins, used to be the family castle of the counts Schenken von Flügelsberg. Today it consists of a few remnants of stone walls and three castle moats. From this viewpoint you have an excellent view of the surrounding countryside.



Viewpoint Eggersberg Ruin

This viewpoint is a must for people who love to look far into the Altmühl Valley. The view goes down an old church ruin, extends very far into all directions and offers the probably most beautiful view of the Lower Altmühl Valley. Information boards provide the visitors with details about Eggersberg Ruin and the natural beauty of the scenery.

The Mushroom Viewpoint

The sunny Jura high plateau of the Jachenhausen Mountain with meadows and fields offers a fantastic panoramic view of Riedenburg and its surrounding landscape. You may also hike to the “Schwammerl”, a funny landmark shaped as a big mushroom.

St. Agatha Lake

You find the idyllically situated St. Agatha Lake, which is great for swimming, in the local part of Haidhof. The lake guarantees cooling and swimming fun on hot summer days. The lake is looked after during the season by members of the Wasserwacht, a volunteer rescue organization – mid-April to mid-September on Saturdays and Sundays and on holidays only with good bathing weather. Great lawns for sunbathing invite you to stay. You will also find a kiosk there with a small beer garden and a large parking area (parking fee at weekends).

Devil's Rock Hang-gliding Ramp

About 4 km northeast of Riedenburg, in the local part of Jachenhausen, in one of the oldest flying areas of East Bavaria, you can watch hang-gliders at a very nice hang-gliding spot, the so-called Teufelsfelsen (Devil's Rock). Provided that weather and winds are good they glide from a wooden ramp down into the Altmühl Valley.



Free Time Tips

Farm Experience and Farm Museum

Enjoy great farm experience and the farm museum at the local part of Echendorf (5 km south of Riedenburg). Here visitors are shown old agricultural machinery and devices in their original modes of operation. You also gain insights into the working methods of a modern farm.

Rock Climbing

Steinerne Stadt, Triangelturn, Bärenkopf and Kastlwand – these are some of the names of the many climbing rocks in the Altmühltal Klettergarten between Riedenburg and Essing. The rock massifs of the Franconian Jura offer climbing fun for every type of climbers – beginners as well as advanced climbers.

Mini-golf Course

In a small but nicely arranged botanic garden next to the Kristallmuseum and the Fasslwirtschaft a mini-golf course invites you to have fun games.

Motor biking

The region around Riedenburg is a true Eldorado for motor bikers. Many curvy roads lead you into our town and to the extremely popular river promenade.

Summer Toboggan Run and Leisure Park (Sommerrodelbahn)

You will find the "AltmühlBob" in the local part of Haidhof, about 3 km away from Riedenburg, next to the attractive St. Agatha Lake. It's one of the most modern summer toboggan runs worldwide. Tobogganing fun for the whole family on more than 1000 m route distance is guaranteed. The comfortable toboggans run on stainless steel pipes completely safe and noiseless.

Summer tobogganing run: in the month of March only on Saturdays and Sundays; from April to October daily from 10:00 to 17:30;

Quad-run: from March to October only on Saturdays and Sundays from 10:00 to 17:30 or by prior arrangement, and additionally during the Bavarian summer holidays daily from 10:00 to 17:30.



Free Time Tips

Town Pond and Canal Sculpture Trail

The town pond was built during the construction works of the Main-Danube-Canal within the framework of changes along the shores of the former Altmühl River. The sculpture trail, which was created in 2017 during a sculptor's symposium on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the Main-Danube-Canal, invites you to go for a walk, and a playground offers ample space for the little ones to romp around. At special dates festivities take place around the town pond and on the lake stage, e.g. the Medieval Festival or the midsummer celebrations with fireworks and festive excursion boat tours on the Main-Danube-Canal.

Fitness Trail

Go to the Wanderparkplatz (hiker's parking lot) at the Jachenhausen Mountain and you will find the starting point of a fitness trail with many stations leading right through a forest. Here you can do sports as you please.

Drei-Burgen-Park (Three-Castles-Park)

Opposite the Schambacher Weg the natural river bed of the Schambach creek has been integrated into a Wassertretanlage (Kneipp water treading pool). The bed of the creek is overshadowed by trees, offers nice cooling on hot summer days and is most suitable for refreshing Kneipp cures. Right next-door there is an outdoor-fitness park with different workout devices and a barefoot park.

Culture

Besides the wonderful nature in and around Riedenburg there are also numerous cultural sights and experiences of the special kind for you to be discovered. Immerse yourselves into Riedenburg's eventful history and visit one of the historic castles or ruins. Get to know interesting facts about the history and crystals in one of Riedenburg's museums and go on a thrilling travel through time in the archaeological Altmühl Valley.

Burg Prunn (Pruun Castle)

Burg Prunn is one of the best-kept knight's castles in Bavaria. In 1575 a precious manuscript of the Nibelungenlied was found here. The exhibition about the history of Prunn Castle ("Ritter, Recken, edle Frauen – Burg Prunn und das Nibelungenlied") gives you exciting insights into the time of the Middle Ages.

Catholic Parish Church

St. John the Baptist

From the 13th century onwards a small church was located at the place of today's parish church, consecrated to St. John the Baptist. In 1739 a new church was built, only the original steeple remained. Plasterers, painters and sculptors created a fascinating treasure of the late Baroque. The big Baroque windows, which are framed by beautiful stucco, are very impressive. The altarpiece shows the angel's announcement to Maria.



Culture

Rosenburg mit Falkenhof (Rosenburg Castle and Falconry)

This castle is Riedenburg's landmark built in the second half of the 12th century. It is named after the roses the counts of "Ritenburg" had in their coat of arms and which were also taken into Riedenburg's town coat of arms. Today the Rosenberg houses an open-air falconry and a falconry museum. During the breathtaking shows you can see free flying golden eagles, sea eagles, vultures, kites and falcons. Flight shows from mid March to mid October every day except Monday at 11:00 and 15:00!

Rabenstein Ruin

Rabenstein Ruin ist the oldest castle complex in Riedenburg. It used to be an independent and terraced manor house which was built on the narrow mountain crest at the end of the Schambach Valley. Nowadays you only see the remnants of a residential and fortified tower there at the western side and fragments of the circle wall at the lower part. Find out more about Rabenstein Ruin during a hike on the trail named „Drei-Burgen-Steig“.



Tachenstein Ruin

Tachenstein Castle was presumably built in the 12th or 13th century. In the 16th century it was already mentioned as a ruin whose 10m high remnants have been preserved until today. From the viewing platform near the ruin you have a wonderful view of the old town of Riedenburg and the surrounding Jura slopes. You may explore Tachenstein Ruin during a hike on the trail named „Drei-Burgen-Steig“.

Schloss Eggersberg (Eggersberg Castle)

The picturesquely situated Eggersberg Castle offers a breathtaking view of the Altmühl Valley to you. The castle hotel is a great place for a few days of recreation but is also well-known as a unique backdrop for events, conferences or weddings.

Hofmarkmuseum (Museum Hofmark)

The Hofmarkmuseum shows you a great number of exhibits from different historical epochs, e.g. a magnificent bronze belt or grave findings of the Hallstatt period (around 500 BC) from Untereggersberg. You will also see the medieval Eggersberg Castle, original knight's armour and the Altmühl Valley in classical paintings.

Kristallmuseum (Crystal Museum)

The world's biggest group of mountain-crystals with a weight of 7.8 tons is located there. Besides others a big collection of tourmaline and diamonds can be seen, and the exhibition „Die Edelsteine der Sterne“ (Precious stones of the stars) interprets the interaction between astrological signs and their respective precious stones. The „Kristalligelchen“ (Little Crystal Hedgehog) explains the world of precious stones to children. Even special kids' tours can be booked.

Tip: Visit the regularly changing special exhibitions.

For groups the museum is also open outside opening hours by arrangement.

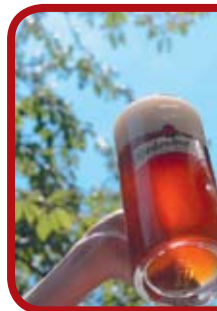

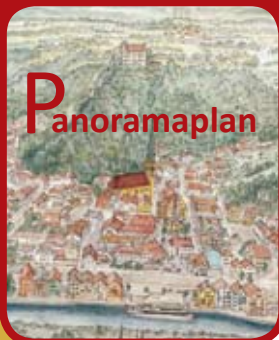
